

RELIVING FOND MEMORIES



Doug Martin had published two books called 'Frozen Community' where he wanted to have skaters tell funny stories about their time on the road. Stories were posted before but worth sharing again. Read on.

Here is a great recollection from Darlene Ripepe (Pepe)

Whenever we were in Chicago, most of us stayed at the Croydon Hotel, which some of us called 'Menopause Manor,' because retired show people lived there year round. There was a great piano bar downstairs


off the lobby where we would hang out after the show.

I was rooming with Jan Wood (Nurse) when a fire broke out on our floor. I was sick, so was in bed early. Jan came into the bedroom and asked if I was smoking. I said no, but I'd just blown out a candle. The next thing I know, Jan is yelling, {"Fire!) There's a trunk on fire!" While Jan was on the phone to the front desk to report the fire, I jumped out of bed, threw on some clothes, and ran to the window. We were on the 18th floor, so there was no escape there, nor could a fire truck ladder reach us. We went out into the hallway, trying to get to the fire escape, but the smoke was so thick we couldn't see. Our only option was to get to the elevator, so we got on our hands and knees and were crawling toward the elevator, trying to stay below the smoke level. Just then Bill Brenner and Terry Head came running out of the elevator. Bill reached the fire hose on the wall, broke the glass, turned on the water and aimed the hose at the burning trunk there in the hallway. In the meantime, Terry was knocking on doors, yelling, "Fire! Everyone out!" Just as Terry was heading back toward the elevator, Bill came around the corner toward Jan and me (still on our hands and knees) with the water going full blast, and hit Terry square in the chest, sending him flying backwards six feet, where he landed on his rear. It was like watching laurel and Hardy. Jan and I finally made it to the elevator and down to the lobby... laughing all the way. Most of the girls were naked underneath their fur coats, holding their taxes, jewelry or wine bottles! When it was safe to return to the hotel, most of us made a beeline for the bar, partying and laughing well into the night.

Oddly enough, it was never discovered who set the fire. After that, I never stayed higher than the 3rd floor. That way, either a fire ladder could reach me, or I could take my changes and jump! Wheeeee.

There'll Be No Pulling Hair Here

There will be no hair pulling among the cast of Ice Capades visiting here this week in a blaze of graceful color. It would be much too expensive a scene.

Wigs are the crowning-dash glory touch in each scene. Every girl skater wears six, which means that at least 300 wigs travel in huge crates whenever the show takes to the road.

The girls are all blonds in their precision number, white wigged for the ballet, and brown –haired for the zodiac scene. The brown wigs, all long and natural hair represent a considerable investment and are securely locked up when not on show.

"We did have a few stolen in the past" explained Taffy Wood, wife of skating star, Tim Wood 'so we don't take any chances with them now. The others are horsehair and lacquered. You wouldn't wear them on the street, so they're not tempted to the light fingered.

The tightly curled Afro wigs worn with dazzling gold mesh costumes are fussiest to keep looking right. Each as its own earrings attached and each girl keeps her own in curl. So if they have a post – show date, they have two heads of hair to set.

Does anyone flip her wig during the show, blonde Ann Gardhouse was asked?

She shrugged.

"When you fall, the wig goes. You just scramble up and plop it back on. And go madly to keep up with the rest of the line. It's quite funny, actually.

Ann is a Hollywood Cinderella story. The understudy who got her chance to step into the role she was practicing. This year she plays the role of the little girl looking for an old fashioned circus in the opening number.

Gloria Lor, as brunette as Ann is blonde, is the line captain. She's in charge of all the girls. "I keep them in shape." She smiles. And she skates too and wears the appropriate number of wigs.

"They're comfortable. Easy. The wigs. But not the headdresses.

The headdresses, each representing a different sign of the zodiac are magnificent = five foot high handmade creations. Each is brilliantly colored, outlined in shimmering sequins and beads. They are worth about \$2,000 each.

Sturdy slim silver wires keep the panels rigid and their size dictates that only the tall showgirls wear them. They weigh 10 pounds but the problem of balance is more urgent than the problem of weight.

"You can't skate fast in them." Explains Jan Wood who is tall enough to wear them. "They create so much wind resistance so you are thrown off balance."

They are easier on the eye than they are on the skater – and the showgirls know it.

"They kill your neck, they are so unwieldy" sighs Jan.

Then she tried one on and it was instant glamor.
