Barbara "Kregling" Schellhammer – Feb. 20, 2023



June 24, 1927 - February 20, 2023 Arlington, TX - Barbara "Bobbye" Schellhammer, 95, Arlington icon, community volunteer, ice skater, skier, artist, passed February 20, 2023, in her apartment at Town Village Crossing in Arlington, TX, after a brief illness. Survivors include her brother Gene Kregling, her six children: Mark Schellhammer, Scott Schellhammer, Brent Schellhammer, Gregg Schellhammer, Jeff Schellhammer, and Kim Lytle; nine grandchildren, and sixgreat-grandchildren.

She was born Barbara Leonora Kregling on June 24, 1927, in Stratford, Connecticut. After graduation from Stratford High School in 1945, she trained for ice-skating in Lake Placid, NY, then toured the U.S. for two years as a skater with the Ice **Capades**. She met and married August Schellhammer, Jr., an aeronautical engineer, while working at Chance Vought. In 1949 they moved to Arlington, TX as part of the company move to Grand Prairie, TX. She spent the majority of her earlier life raising six children and supporting her husband's career. She served with Cub Scouts, as a den mother, YMCA, several PTA's, Rolling Hills CC and Shady Valley CC, Arlington Memorial Hospital Women's Auxiliary, LTV Engineers Wives Club, and Arlington Women's Club. She spent several years mastering the art of painting producing wonderful oils and watercolors. In 1970 she returned to ice-skating as director of the ice-skating school at the Ice Capades Chalet that opened at the Forum 303 mall in Grand Prairie. Her passion for skating continued in 1977 when she started and directed the Tandy Center Ice Skating School in Ft. Worth, retiring in 1991. She also taught private lessons at Plaza of the Americas and Galleria Malls in Dallas, and the Parks Mall in Arlington, teaching and loving every student who stepped on the ice, no matter their age. She volunteered at the Arlington Arts League and Theater Arlington, and was a Prime Stepper at Miss Persis Dance Studio. She was a member of Trinity United Methodist Church in Arlington. She enjoyed taking many trips to Colorado and New Mexico to ski. Her outgoing personality and ability to converse with anyone made her an instant friend to all.

Alan Mathews – March 12, 2023



Alan Wayne Mathews, 64, of Elizabeth, PA was born January 17, 1959 in Duquesne, PA. He was the beloved son to the late Lloyd T. Mathews and Betty Morris. Alan graduated from Elizabeth Forward High School, Class of 76, and went on to study at Penn State University, Carnegie Mellon University, and University of Hawaii, Hilo. He was the oldest of three siblings. In his youth, Alan was an amateur figure skater alongside his sister Ellen. They competed along the East coast as members of the United States Figure Skating Association. After graduation, Alan turned professional and auditioned for the **Ice Capades**. He toured the United States and Canada for several years, and worked his way up to become lighting designer.

Alan spent many years living in Hilo, HI, where he pursued an active lifestyle that included scuba diving and spearfishing. He returned to Elizabeth and reconnected with his skating colleagues while working at several ice rinks in the area. Alan also assisted his mother and aunt in their activities with the Pittsburgh Council of Three Rivers Indian Center. Alan was a contract security guard at the West Mifflin location of Bombardier Transportation Holdings. Alan departed this life on March 12, 2023 at Jefferson Hospital in Jefferson Hills, PA. He was preceded in death by his father, Lloyd Thurman Mathews, mother, Betty Frances Morris, and sister, Ellen LaRue Mathews. Alan is survived by his sister, Elaine Cappiello, brother in-law Raymond, and his beloved nephews, Armond and Jude, all of Madison, CT.



RELIVING FOND MEMORIES



Doug Martin had published two books called 'Frozen Community' where he wanted to have skaters tell funny stories about their time on the road. Stories were posted before but worth sharing again.

John Bate came up with a few stories of his own. Read on.

Russia was quite the experience – remember, this was the time of the Cold War – with all the pre-trip lectures on protocol, what to do and what not to do. John Harris gave us all bright red blazers for the trip. While in New York, five of us; George Verbewski (who went by the stage name of George Bussey), Bill Rudolph, Mickey Squires, Bob Nordlund and myself, bought nice black bowler hats to go with our outfits. They were very impressive. In fact, I still have mine.

I was Chairman of the Employees Committees, a committee formed before we went to Russia. Its purpose was to give the line skaters a voice to air any problems or grievances between themselves and management. It worked very well because everyone was afraid of John H. Harris. We b ought a lot of supplies: Coca Cola, gum, chocolate bars, soap, nylon stockings, all of which were either very scarce or not available in Russia. As I recall, John Harris drank most of the Cola.

One problem when we got to Russia was the new line skaters didn't get much money and didn't have any spending cash. Marilyn Braun (now Bate) and I met with John Harris to discuss the problem. He assured us it would be looked into immediately., Bob Nordfund had a sign made up, which read "Ice Capades on Strike" and sat in the hallway in the arena. Needless to say,

Dick Palmer, who was Vice President of Ice Capades, wasn't at all impressed, even though it was a joke.

One night while playing at the US Embassy, I was walking home, clowning around on one of the bridges over the Moscow River. All of a sudden a soldier with a gun and a very large voice started yelling at me to come down from the top of the bridge. When I saw the gun I got the message. I was reprimanded, of course, and Jack Balmer informed me the next day that the US Embassy was off limits for me.

The big thing in Russia was that everyone in the show as out souvenir hunting for icons. They traded gum, nylons, jeans or anything American for icons. The Russians also had our Zamboni for a few days. Rumor was that they 'borrowed' it in order to make one of their own. I believe it.

The Empress Hotel in Vancouver, BC had a quarter of the musicians playing music in the lobby at Tea Time. Cone of the tunes they played was 'Sugar Plum Fairy' from The Nut Cracker. To add some excitement to Tea Time, I bought a pogo stick and came around the corner of the lobby, bouncing merrily on my way. You should have seen the looks. Funnier yet, was when I went upstairs and started jumping in one of the rooms. Can you imagine Aja Zanova on a pogo stick? During the fun, the desk clerk phoned the room and said 'Whatever you're doing is knocking the plaster off the ceiling in the room below you!' That room happened to be occupied by Walter Hadlick, who was the manager of Ice Capades at the time! We all had a lot of laughs about that one.

These are a few of the fun-filled times we had. There are dozens of stories I could tell, like hiding the weigh in scales, and adding vodka to the water cooler at the Race Track tank date in Phoenix. We were all so fortunate to have worked with ice Capades and to have had so much fun doing it. We did three shows a day, for several days, then we'd move on to the next city and start all over again. It was all part of the experience. There were days you could leave your hotel door wide open and ask any passing cast member to come in and join you for a nightcap, or just say hello. Our Ice Capades memories will live on in our hearts forever. What a special time it was.

Let's keep Doug's legacy going. I'm sure there are more 'interesting' stories out there from your time in the show. If you would like to share, please send them to me.
