Reliving a Historical Production Bolero 1985

After watching Bolero again, our alumni recollected their experience and wanted to share their excitement that they had posted on Facebook.

Ted Shuffle's classic production of Ravel's Bolero (re-staging for Ice Capades - assisted by David Baker) - Featuring Tommy Miller, Tom Dickson, Jeff LaBrake & Priscilla Hill, Catarina Lindgren, Robin Howard, and the Skating Ensemble....Even so, tape in my video camera ran out at the finish....Shot in Philadelphia, PA., by Carl Moseley.

<u>Jeff LaBrake to - Gail Donaldson Lucas</u> I skated this production of Bolero in Ice Capades East & Continental Companies as the pair in East & the solo in Continental. It was originally choreographed by Ted Shuffle for Holiday on Ice but from what I remember, Ice Capades and

Holiday on Ice did a swap... the Bolero number, for the rights to use the Smurfs in HOI. David Baker came to Duluth, MN to set the Bolero number for Ice Capades and it was a huge success. The Bolero number closed the first half of the show and I lost count as to how many standing ovations it received night after night, week after week... Even in the smallest of cities on the Continental Tour it was well received with standing ovations. Starting with one skater on the ice and building up to eventually a full cast entering to different counts all in unison to the final note was brilliant. Even though the audience might not have known how difficult the back change loops were to do in synchronization, the visuals leading up to the climax of the number left them all spellbound. Tom Dickson was the first soloist to start the number in the East & West Companies and I skated it in Continental... and a bit of inside information.... We did 56 counts of 6 of back change loops! The skaters who entered from different spots around the arena and from the curtain had to count the many counts of 6 to know when to make their entrance.

<u>Don Watson</u> - "Bolero" was one of Ted Shuffle's best work if not the best. It was such a success when Ted has previous major suit was a big success when Ted previously. His choreography for "Counterpoint" has to be a code second choreography.

<u>DeeDee Dowding -</u> Bolero was a masterpiece of choreography and so different from any other number. I did it all three years...briefly in the line but mostly in the pairs spot. It was exhilarating and as Jeff LaBrake stated, most audiences loved the buildup and it was well received.

<u>Sue Packard Rodeghier</u> Yes, Shuffle originally did it in HOI. I worked with him in Europe (Hollywood Ice Revue) and I think one of his assistants set most of the step by step choreography because I don't think he had ever learned many figures. The 7th test loops and rockers are tough....not a lot of skaters would have been able to perform them.

<u>Simone Grigorescu-Alexander</u> I studied Jeff's Bolero videos before I joined. I was so excited when I got to skate it. The choreography was perfection.

<u>Simone Grigorescu-Alexander</u> - I skated the Bolero on Continental, it's last year. It was a privilege to do so and I believe the skaters, especially the soloists were happy to skate a production of its artistic and choreographic quality. Did the average Joe public understand it or appreciate it? Maybe yes maybe no.... Success is not always determined by those standards. Art and entertainment should elevate the human heart and intellect, touch the human soul. Most entertainment now and then touches one from the waist down primarily. It's good and important to have the odd opportunity to view something that strives to higher ground. There have always been plenty of choreographies in shows that make you laugh, that titillate, that are great eye candy....yes, these may be more popular with the average Joe but there is always room for those numbers that strive to touch the human spirit.

Gail Donaldson Lucas - WOW! I wonder if the audiences recognized the difficulty?

<u>Jim Hurst</u> asked <u>Gail Donaldson Lucas</u> - I doubt it...one of the YouTube comments was super duper negative...viewer was not a skater. Although I think this Bolero is stunning...for non-skaters watching figures is like watching paint dry! LOL.

<u>Jeff LaBrake</u> Thanks very much for the inside info! Very interesting. Happy to hear the number was so well received! I am curious, did it take long to match up/sych the rhythm with the loops so that you were all together? I would think that would have been difficult. Did anyone fall doing loops, LOL...I know it rarely happens, but I've done it and I've seen skaters fall on loops while taking a figure test. Yikes!

Jeff LaBrake to Jim Hurst - Skaters falling during the loops ... not that I remember, but there are two funny things that happened during the first year of the tour doing Bolero. First of all, Prisciclla Hill was my original partner but tore her Achilles tendon doing a back flip with me, that wasn't the funny part. Priscilla is the youngest skater in the world to have passed her U.S.F.S.A. 8th figure, she was 9 when she received that honor. Priscilla had amazing figures, many times they would be 1 line! Although she used to get corrections from the Performance Director saying, "Priscilla, we don't need to you to trace the loops, one on top of the other, we just need you to stay on the music!" The counts in the music for the loops was to push off on 1, pull through the change of edge on 3 then into the 3rd circle on 4,5,6, and into the loop on 1,2 and pull out of the loop on 3 and back to your center on 4,5,6, and then repeat to finish one full pattern. The second funny thing I remember was we were at the Capital Center in D.C. doing the loops at the beginning of the number and it was always so quiet with just the music still in the soft stage. Someone at the top of the mezzanine level on stage left either dropped a basketball or deliberately tossed one and it bounced all the way down the stairs of the arena with an endless thump, thump, thump.... and bounced over the side dasher boards and rolled across all of our loops and hit the dash on the ice on the stage right side. Luckily it didn't interfere with anyone's loops, but we all had a very hard time trying to keep a straight face! We didn't even want to look at each other for fear of bursting out laughing.

<u>Jim Hurst</u> - Hi <u>Jeff LaBrake</u>, thanks for the stories!! Wow, gold medalist at 9!! I never knew that about her. I thought you were going to say she got stuck in her tracing/rut, lol. Love the basketball story! We had audience members walk onto the ice now and then during a number. That was weird to come face to face with some guy on the ice! The only bouncing ball we had washere it comes.....Freddie Trenkler!! Loved Freddie!!

Reliving Fond Memories from the Wardrobe Department

Jerry Lee Kidd shares some 'on the road' secrets from the Wardrobe department

Not sure but thinking the Cap Center with the jumbotron TV. Frank Sweiding and Gayle Hamula were in Latin Fire, Frank of course had a one-piece jumpsuit made out of heavy lycra, well over time the costume had stretched and gotten baggy, so I say to Frank, how about I take it apart in the crotch and take it up and in some. He was in agreement. So, I am pretty sure it was a three show Saturday, between 2nd and 3rd, I took his costume and released all four seams in the crotch, no problem. My first mistake was not measuring the length of the girth. So, I put it back together with not much time to spare before he has to wear it again. Well, the first time I saw it on him was on the jumbotron and I almost choked. He had this enormous crotch bulge. I had taken it up and in too much. Within minutes every boy in the chorus was in Wardrobe wanting me to give them a bulge like Frank's. Needless to say, I redid it and it looked fine for the rest of the tour.

Another on the road story from Jerry. This dress almost got me into big trouble with Armin in the studio. Carol's dress had begun to look flat and you could tell it was damp, the feathers absorbed moisture and held onto it. So, in a city that had washer and dryer, I took the dress and put it into the dryer on low heat to dry it out. Well Carol saw this and automatically thought I had machine washed her dress, so she called the studio to tell them what I had done, in no time Armin was on the phone calling me. Once I had explained all was good. Oh yeah, and the dress came out looking like new..



If memory serves me correctly, Kitty and Peter were making quest appearances between the companies, as I would have never had the time to do what I am about to tell you all. They both came to me before they were leaving and asked if there was anyway to lengthen their costumes in the girth (body). Well to anyone who sews, this is about impossible to do, but I told them I would do what I could. Thought about this for a while and came up with this solution. Go to Jules, borrow a couple of stage weights and some rope. I ran the rope through the leg holes up through the crotch and out the other leg. Tied on the stage weights and using a spray bottle wet down both costumes through the body and let gravity take over. After several days removed the weights and waited for the outcome. Both were so pleased and could not thank me enough. Never told them how I accomplished the feat. Now to be totally honest with all of you,

especially the girls. When you would ask me to take in your costume because you had lost weight or some other reason, I would always say "just hang it up", then, when I had the time, I would either change the crotch pad or arm shields and call it a day. When you came back to get and wore it, you were always so grateful for me taking it in. Now you know the awful truth, it was never touched. Sorry guys.

Seeing the old Lafayette and Croydon made me remember something from those old days. A Jerry on the road story. In one of those hotels when it came time to leave and I was packing, my carry on was on the shelf in the closet, the buckle on the strap had become wedged between the wall and the shelf (space big enough to get my fingers in) and upon trying to release my buckle, I felt something else up there, when I finally got the buckle loose and the mystery item/items this is what was wedged up there. I have no idea how long it had been there before I found it and often wonder what the story was that went along with the head and leg.
